Improvements at the Morwell Historical Society Building

I'm pleased to advise that the Society was successful in December in receiving a grant from the Latrobe Valley Authority towards the installation of 4 air conditioning units for heating in the winter, the upgrade of the switchboard, and the installation of an Everhot 5 Litre Hot Boiling Unit in the kitchen. We will now be able to disconnect the gas supply and save \$420 annually.

When these works are completed, the Society is looking forward to increasing its activities in the winter months.

Over these past weeks with improved weather, Millers Plumbing have finally been able to carry out the re-roofing works on the building which is now looking impressive.

In the coming weeks Wayne Vincent will be carrying out the re-painting and repairing of water damaged areas in the front room.

Australia Day 2019 Community Service of the Year

Bruce McMaster has encouraged people to take an interest in local history.

Preserving Latrobe City's history and helping people understand the region's past and its significance is a priority for the 2019 Latrobe City Community Service of the Year award recipient, Bruce McMaster.

Mr McMaster is president of the Morwell Historical Society and said his nomination recognised the dedication and persistence of the society and its members.

"We try our best to do the best for the community and spread the information around because history is very important to keep. Otherwise, if you don't know your history, how do you know your future," Mr McMaster said.

"These days a lot of people are doing family history and they come along and say: "Grandpa was here. Where did he live? What did he do" so often we've got enough history on that person to make a story for their relative."

The former municipal health inspector moved to Morwell in the late 1950s with his wife, Elsie, from Foster and spent his working career with a number of local councils.

The McMasters' involvement with the historical society began in the early 1970s, when Elsie took on the role of the "very capable secretary", before Bruce became more involved after his retirement in the early 2000s.

Mr McMaster was instrumental in obtaining a loan from historical society members and supporters who collectively purchased the former Masonic Lodge on Hazelwood Road about four years ago with the intention to repay the borrowed funds within 10 years.

"Bruce has demonstrated outstanding leadership in welding together a diverse group of people into a formidable committee of management," a historical society spokeswoman said.

Mr McMaster encouraged people to "get out and enjoy themselves", but to "make some of the enjoyment beneficial to others".

"There's no point sitting down doing nothing. A lot of people say it's great, they're going to retire but then they've got nothing to do afterwards and that's the important part – to get on and do something if you can," Mr McMaster said.

He said the award came as a "pleasant surprise" but acknowledged his team at the historical society who "have worked extremely hard to make [the society] what it is today".

MORWELL'S "WHITE CITY" AIRFIELD AND AIR PAGEANTS

Morwell's "White City" airfield was in use as a landing ground long before the SEC decided to construct the married quarters housing settlement that gave the airfield the unique name of White City. In July 1948 a volunteer group was formed to provide emergency night landing assistance to aircraft in distress. With the consent of Mr Alan Brinsmead, the war time Morwell emergency landing ground was repositioned to the Brinsmead property to the west of Morwell. The newly formed Air Emergency Committee then held working bees to clear obstructions and suitably mark the area.

On September 14th 1949 the Latrobe Valley Aero Club was formed. With no money, aeroplanes or flying instructors, the challenges facing the fledgling Aero Club were enormous, but the members had a great deal of enthusiasm and, fortunately, the Club had free access to a landing ground courtesy of the Brinsmead family. The Club immediately decided to hold an Aerial Pageant on Australia Day 1950. With great support from the RAAF and civilian aircraft operators this event was very successful and turned out to be the first of five Australia Day Air Pageants held at the "White City" airfield. These events were all well attended and the funds raised enabled the Club to commence operating.

Over the next few years the Club built two aircraft hangars on field. The first was a rudimentary shed made of bush poles and flattened tar barrels, whilst the second, a more substantial structure, was a fire damaged Armco steel building. The Club was also able to rent a house in the newly constructed "White City" married quarters estate to serve as a Club Rooms and offices.

As 1954 loomed the Club again planned to hold an Air Pageant, but the date was moved by a week to February 1st to avoid clashing with other local events. As in previous years great support was provided by the RAAF. The Air Force participation included a combined aerial and ground display, including Vampire Jets, Mustangs fighters, Wirraways, Tiger Moths, Dakotas and Lincoln bomber. Further attractions included demonstration by the renowned Skywriter, Mr Fed Hoinville and a glider display. A highlight was the attendance of the Right Honourable R. G. Casey, Federal Minister for External Affairs, who gave an Australia Day address. Mr. and Mrs. Casey, later Lord and Lady Casey, both keen pilots, were the Patrons of the LV Aero Club for many years.

The next year, 1955, Defence spending cut-backs prevented the RAAF from participating. Fortunately the Club was able to obtain support from the Royal Australian Navy, but this meant moving the event to West Sale aerodrome as the Navy's Sea Furies fighters could not operate from White City airfield.

In 1956 an Air Meet was held at Yarram to open the new "Parkside" aerodrome. From then on the Club was very busy establishing the new Latrobe Valley Aerodrome, now Latrobe Regional Airport, but it did find time to support its Country Flights by conducting air pageants at Yarram in both 1957 and 1959 and at Bairnsdale in 1958. The Club moved from "White City" to the new site in mid-1959, however, it was not until March 10th 1963 that the Club was able mount an air pageant to open the new facility.



GLV10: Australia's first regional channel

Timeline

1961 December 9, opened after seven years of planning by Gippsland Telecasters 1963 Direct relay of new from GTV9 1970s Partnered with BCV8 Bendigo and STV8 Mildura **Name changes** Southern Cross TV – 1982 Southern Cross Network 1989 SCN 1993 Ten Victoria 1994 Southern Cross Ten 2001



1992- Southern Cross Network of GLV and BCV expand its signal into the regions of Ballarat, Shepparton and Albury, while the incumbents from these regions in turn expanded into the areas covered by GLV and BCV.

May 1994 - saw all local production ceased and the network essentially becoming a straight relay of Network Ten's schedule.

2000 GLV was forced to shut down its Channel 8 signal in Gippsland and move to UHF Channel 37. This was to accommodate the launch of the digital signal from GTV9 in Melbourne which was to use the 8 frequency.


